Brecht's Caucasian Chalk Crele is a parable up there with the best of them. In war-forn Caucasus, the In war-forn Caucasus, the In war-forn Caucasus, the properties of the law and the poor peasants are the victims. But the rich baddies end up down at heel as a new sense of justice prevails and

the countrymen rejoice.

At the centre of all this is the ancient Chinese parable of the chalk circle – with a typical Brechtina 20th century twist.

The political overtones are obvious but, above all, this folk tale is good, solid extertisiment.
