The story line, involving two TV crime writers caught in a web of blackmail and murder, takes various turns and ends with an unexpected twist.

Although Christine Walden who plays Harold Kent's wife, Emma, and Graham Underbill, who plays Paul Riggs, fluffed their lines on a few occasions, these are minor flaws.

Neil Monro-Davis as pompous Harold Kent and Graham Underbill as philandering alcoholic Paul Riggs stole the show with their on-stage camaraderie.

Murder By Misadventure is a very amusing production and judging by the response from the first-night audience, it seems they would agree.
